

SPROTBROUGH AND CUSWORTH PARISH BOUNDARY WALK

Sunday 19TH May 2024

Come and join us for the first walk around the boundary of Sprotbrough and Cusworth Parish.

In medieval times 'Beating the Bounds' was a regular practice throughout the country in which parishioners walked the boundary to assert their rights to the land and prevent encroachment by neighbouring parishes. It may also have served to teach youngsters the limits of their parish. The 'beating' refers to the symbolic beating of the ground and notable landmarks on the perimeter with sticks. The custom generally took place during three days known as Rogation Days which fell between the 5th Sunday after Easter and Ascension Day.


The parish boundary is approximately 11 square kilometres. Parts of the western boundary are not accessible by public rights of way therefore the proposed walk is approximately 15km and takes in many parish highlights including; Cusworth Hall, River Don, Sprotbrough Flash SSSI, Sprotbrough Conservation area and Newton Conservation area. The Roman Ridge and Trans Pennine Trail form part of the route (map of the route is on the reverse).

Marshals will accompany walkers at each stage. Appropriate clothing for off road walking conditions should be carried and walking shoes or boots are advised. The route is mainly along pavement and good field paths (all public rights of way). There are a couple of stiles in stages 1 and 2 of the route. Participation is at the individual's risk and discretion. Please take note of the weather conditions for the day and plan accordingly.

Walkers may join the walk at any of four stages. The times for joining the walk are as follows:

- Stop 2 Newton Farm, Newton Lane, Sprotbrough 11am to 11.15am
- Stop 3 Boat Inn, Nursey Lane, Sprotbrough 12pm to 12.30pm
- Stop 4 Cusworth Hall, Back Lane, Cusworth 1.30pm to 2.00pm
- Finish Stop 1 Scawsby Community Centre 2.30pm
